I recently completed a PhD with Gareth Roberts in the Statistics department at Warwick University. I am now working with Thomas House on the application of geometric MCMC methods to epidemics.

My research interests are in MCMC applied to epidemics and models for heterogeneity in contact structures for epidemics. I am also interested in inference for network structures.
